Client Drivers: Help transport cancer patients to cancer related health care appointments. In-Town and Out-of-Town drivers are needed! Clear background check and driving record required. Mileage reimbursed.

Office-General: Greet walk-in patrons and phone inquiries. Answer questions, assist with intake form completion, and other clerical duties as needed. Mon-Fri 9 am-4 pm, hours available anytime!

Satellite Office : Located at Progressive Cancer Care. Volunteers needed to assist cancer patients in treatment by identifying those who qualify for services available through the agency. Obtain client information during intake procedure and coordinate with main office to meet needs. Hours needed are 9-11,am or 1-3 pm daily

Health Fairs: Help spread the word about Cancer Services! Hand out cancer prevention and informational literature and facilitate sign up sheets for free mammograms and prostate screening inquiries. Giveaways and kids' games add fun flair to each event.

Mailings and Labeling: Bulk mailings are assembled at minimum twice annually for donation requests. Duty includes stamping, stuffing and sorting envelopes. Assistance also needed for labeling all education literature to be handed out to the public with Cancer Services contact information.

Special Events: Volunteers needed for set up/tear downs, registration and misc assistance during event. Event Coordinators are also needed behind the scenes to assist in planning and preparation for annual fundraiser events. Check our event calendar and call today!
